



Criteria for Emeritus Member

Emeritus membership is reserved for long-standing members of the Society who have made substantial contributions to the Society (e.g., founding members, fellows), and are designated by the Executive Board.

“Emeritus Members shall be those Members of the Society who are designated Emeritus Members by the Executive Board of the Society.”

Criteria and Procedure:

1. Candidate must be retired from professional employment.
2. Candidate must have been a paying Regular or Retiree Member of the Society for at least twenty years and made substantial contributions to the field of biomechanics and to the Society.
3. Emeritus Member status is nominated by the Past-President and approved by a two-thirds majority vote of the Executive Board.
4. Emeritus Members will retain their voting status and the full privileges of membership for life.
5. The membership fee is waived. Emeritus Members may receive the Journal of Biomechanics at the Society rate.
6. Emeritus Member status may be awarded posthumously.

To be considered for Emeritus membership, please send to the Past-President a copy of your CV and nomination letter describing how you meet the above criteria.
